




Sometimes, people with disability have problems joining in with these activities. For example, a person in a wheelchair cannot walk up stairs. A person who can't see properly may not be able to read our website, and a person who is not able to hear well may not be able to be included in events we hold.



The Town of Claremont works very hard to fix these problems as we believe it is the right thing to do. The Western Australian Government also tell us to fix these problems, and we create a plan to reduce problems for people with disability. The plan the government asks us to write is called a *Disability Access and Inclusion Plan*. This is what our plan looks like:



<u>Access</u> means making sure people with disability can use our buildings, parks, information and footpaths, without any problems.




<u>Inclusion</u> means making sure people with disability are included in community events and services, just the same as everyone else.



Our last plan went from 2018 to 2022. It has just finished, and we have written a new one to take us to 2026.

In our last plan, we made lots of improvements. Some of the things we did were:





But we need to do more! Over the next five years, we have made goals in eight areas. They are:

1. <u>Services and</u> <u>Events</u> : We will improve our services so people with disability can join in.	Service
2. <u>Buildings</u> : We will improve our buildings so it is easier for people to move around.	
3. <u>Information</u> : We will make information available to you in different ways.	<text></text>
4. <u>Customer Service</u> : We will make sure our staff are trained to support you, and to understand disability better.	

5. <u>Complaints</u> : We will make it easier for you to give us feedback, or to complain.	
6. <u>Consultation</u> : We will include you in important conversations.	
7. <u>Employment</u> : We will encourage people with disability to apply for jobs with us, and make it easier for them to do this.	
8. <u>Policies</u> : We will improve some of our policies and procedures to make them more disability-friendly.	POLICIES • PROCEDURE •

 ✓ We will hold events at venues which are disability-friendly, and try to improve technology in our buildings. 	Hearing Loop

 ✓ We will invite people with disability to tell us what is important to them when we are making big decisions.
