

# Street Tree Masterplan 2025

## Review of the 2013 Masterplan

- The first masterplan was adopted in 2013
- Since that time only minor modifications have been made
- The ongoing failure of the *Agonis flexuosa* (W.A. Peppermint Trees) and the Polyphagous Shot Hole borer outbreak around the Town of Claremont has led to an extensive review
- This review identified the original Masterplan
  - had limited flexibility
  - small mixture of species
  - only lists a single species per street for all streets in the Town
- As a result of the above, residents contact the Town frequently to raise concerns
- Certain species have not thrived due to disease, suitability, climate and soil conditions
- The introduction of the Polyphagous Shot Hole Borer in 2021 has impacted the choice of species for the Town's Street Tree Master Plan. In order to support the maintenance of tree canopy, the Town needs to exercise some flexibility.
- Local fauna has fewer options for habitat.

## Grandfather Trees

There are currently six species of Grandfather Tree that have been previously planted but due to repeated failures are no longer viable. **subject to future reviews**) (**subject to future reviews**)

- Western Australian Peppermint (*Agonis flexuosa*)
- Jarrah (*Eucalyptus marginata*)
- Liquidambar (*Liquidambar styraciflua*)
- Red Flowering Gum (*Corymbia ficifolia*)
- Coral Tree (*Erythrina sykesii*)
- London Plane Tree (*Platanus x acerifolia*)

## Tree Species Selection

Factors which have been used to determine the suitable species are:

- The existing streetscape
- Community feedback from Town wide survey (completed September 2022)
- Attractive appearance and canopy cover
- Suitability to Perth's climate as well as drought tolerance
- Disease and pest resistance
- Growth habit and rate
- Increased biodiversity and habitat for fauna
- Ongoing maintenance
- Availability from plant nurseries

Verge sizes have been defined as three types:

**1. Restricted locations**

Narrow verges or median islands

**2. Standard locations**

Average sized verges

**3. Open locations**

Larger than usual sized verges

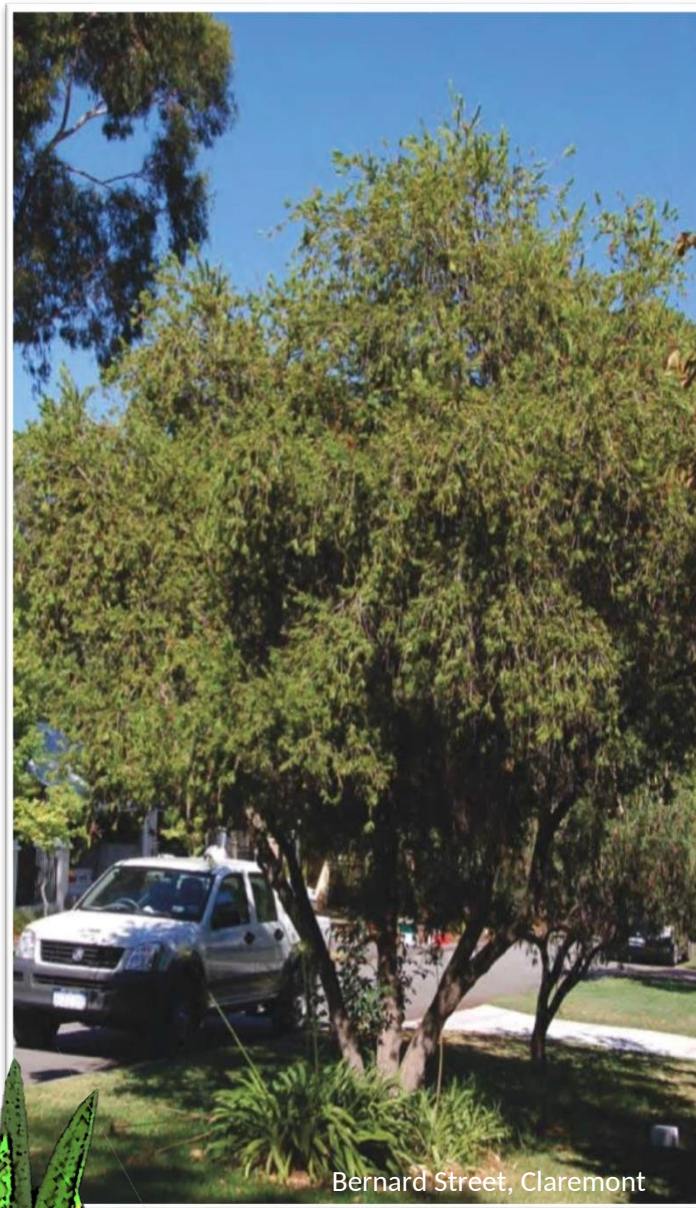

## Bottlebrush

(*Callistemon citrinus* "Kings Park special")



- Native to Australia
- Small evergreen tree to 8m
- Produces masses of red bottlebrush shaped flowers in spring and summer



## Chinese Tallow

(*Triadica sebiferum*)



- Native to China and Japan
- Small to medium deciduous tree to 8m
- Leaves turn red in autumn



## Coral Gum

(*Eucalyptus torquata*)



- Native to Goldfields, WA
- Small, hardy evergreen tree to 8m
- Coral pink, bird attracting flowers from August to December

## Hong Kong Orchid Tree

(*Bauhinia blakeana*)



- Native to Hong Kong
- Small evergreen tree to 8m
- Fragrant pink-purple flowers in Spring



## Manchurian Pear

(*Pyrus ussuriensis*)



Victoria Avenue, Claremont

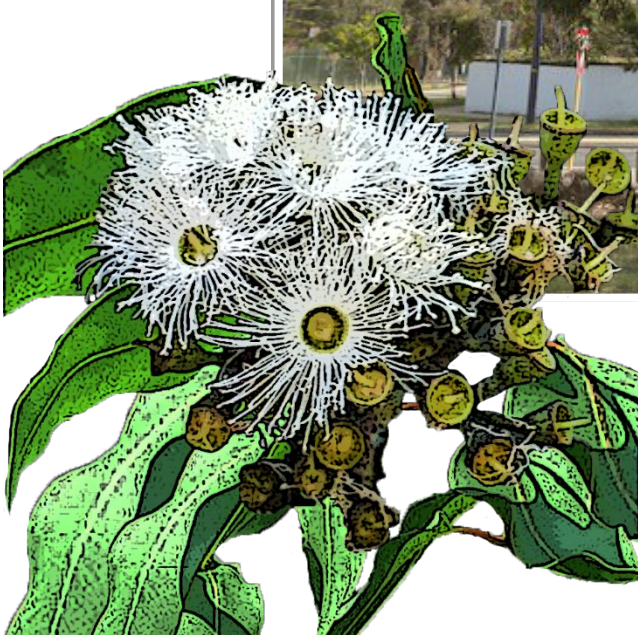


- Native to Northern Japan and Korea
- Small upright deciduous tree to 9m
- Red, yellow and orange foliage in autumn and white flowers in spring



## Spotted Gum

(*Corymbia maculata*)



- Native to coastal Eastern Australia
- Tall evergreen tree up to 15m
- White flowers are displayed from late Winter until Spring



## Tuckeroo

*(Cupaniopsis anacardiodes)*



Swanway Crescent, Claremont



- Native to NSW & QLD
- Small evergreen tree to 8m
- Dark green, glossy leaves and yellow flowers in Summer and Autumn



## Broad-leaved Paperbark

(*Melaleuca viridiflora*)



- Native to Eastern Australia
- Medium evergreen shade tree to 15m
- Bird attracting tree with soft, papery white bark and red flowers

## Water Gum

(*Tristaniaopsis laurina*)



- Native to Eastern Australia
- Medium, evergreen shade tree to 15m
- Perfumed, yellow bird, attractive flowers in spring and summer



## Coolibah

(*Eucalyptus victrix*)



- Native to Western Australia
- Small evergreen tree to 8m
- White bark with grey green foliage
- Small creamy white flowers throughout Summer

## Red Ironbark

(*Eucalyptus sideroxylon rosea*)



- Native to Eastern Australia
- Bird attracting, pink to red flowers during Winter and early Spring
- Deeply furrowed, dark brown to black bark

## Lacebark

- Native to Eastern Australia
- Medium evergreen tree to 15m
- Cream and pink coloured flowers in Spring and Summer

*(Brachychiton populneus)*

- Medium semi deciduous tree to 20m
- Bright pink flowers in Summer



# Leopard Tree

*(Libidibia ferrea)*



- Fast-growing feature tree. Typical height 8m to 10m
- Dappled bark, fern like leaf, yellow flower
- Drought tolerant, pest and disease free

## Chinese Pistachio

(*Pistacia chinensis*)



- Native to China and Taiwan
- Small to medium deciduous tree up to 20m
- Red, orange and yellow Autumn foliage

## Claret Ash

*(Fraxinus angustifolia raywood)*



- Native to South Australia
- Medium deciduous tree to 15m
- Narrow leaves turn a deep burgundy colour in Autumn



# English Oak

(*Quercus robur*)



- Native to Europe and Western Asia
- Medium, wide growing deciduous shade tree to 12m
- Small yellow flowers in Spring and yellow Autumn foliage



## Flooded Gum

*(Eucalyptus rudis)*



- Native to Western Australia
- Large evergreen tree up to 20m
- Bird attracting, white flowers from Winter to Spring

## Jacaranda

(*Jacaranda mimosifolia*)



- Native to South America
- Medium deciduous shade tree to 15m
- Produces clusters of mauve flowers on bare wood in Spring

## Narrow-Leaved Black Peppermint

*(Eucalyptus nicholii)*



- Native to the Northern tablelands of New South Wales
  - Evergreen tree up to 15m tall and dull blue to green hanging foliage with a domed canopy

## Broad-leaved Paperbark

(*Melaleuca viridiflora*)



- Native to eastern Australia
- Medium evergreen shade tree to 15m
- Bird attracting tree with soft, papery white bark, with red flowers

**Poinciana**

- Native to Madagascar
- Medium deciduous shade tree to 10m with spreading canopy
- Produces masses of red flowers in spring

(*Eucalyptus leucoxylon rosea*)

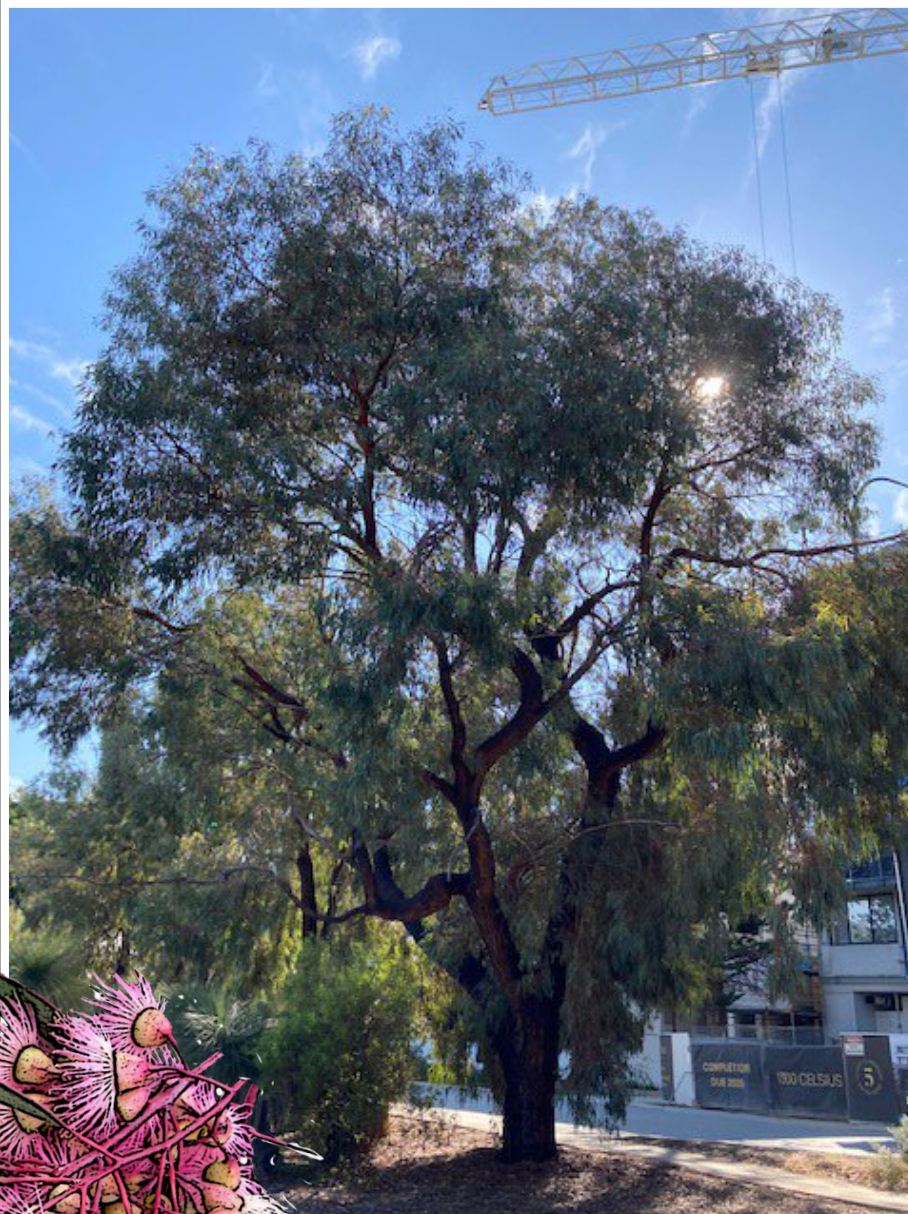


- Native to Victoria, Australia
- Medium evergreen tree to 12m
- Red, bird attracting flowers from June to January

## Red Ironbark

(*Eucalyptus sideroxylon rosea*)



- Native to eastern Australia
  - Bird attracting, pink to red flowers during winter and early spring
  - Deeply furrowed, dark brown to black bark

## Spotted Gum

(*Corymbia maculata*)



- Native to coastal Eastern Australia
- Tall evergreen tree up to 15m
- White flowers are displayed from late Winter until Spring

## Swamp Sheoak

(*Casuarina obesa*)



- Native to Western Australia
- Medium-large upright evergreen tree 10-15m
- Grey-green pine like needle leaves

(*Tristania laurina*)



- Native to Eastern Australia
- Medium evergreen shade tree to 15m
- Perfumed, yellow bird, attractive flowers in Spring and Summer

## Tuckeroo

(*Cupaniopsis anarcardiodes*)



- Native to New South Wales and Queensland
- Small evergreen tree to 8m
- Dark green, glossy leaves and yellow flowers in Summer and Autumn

## Cottonwood

(*Hibiscus tilaceous rubra*)

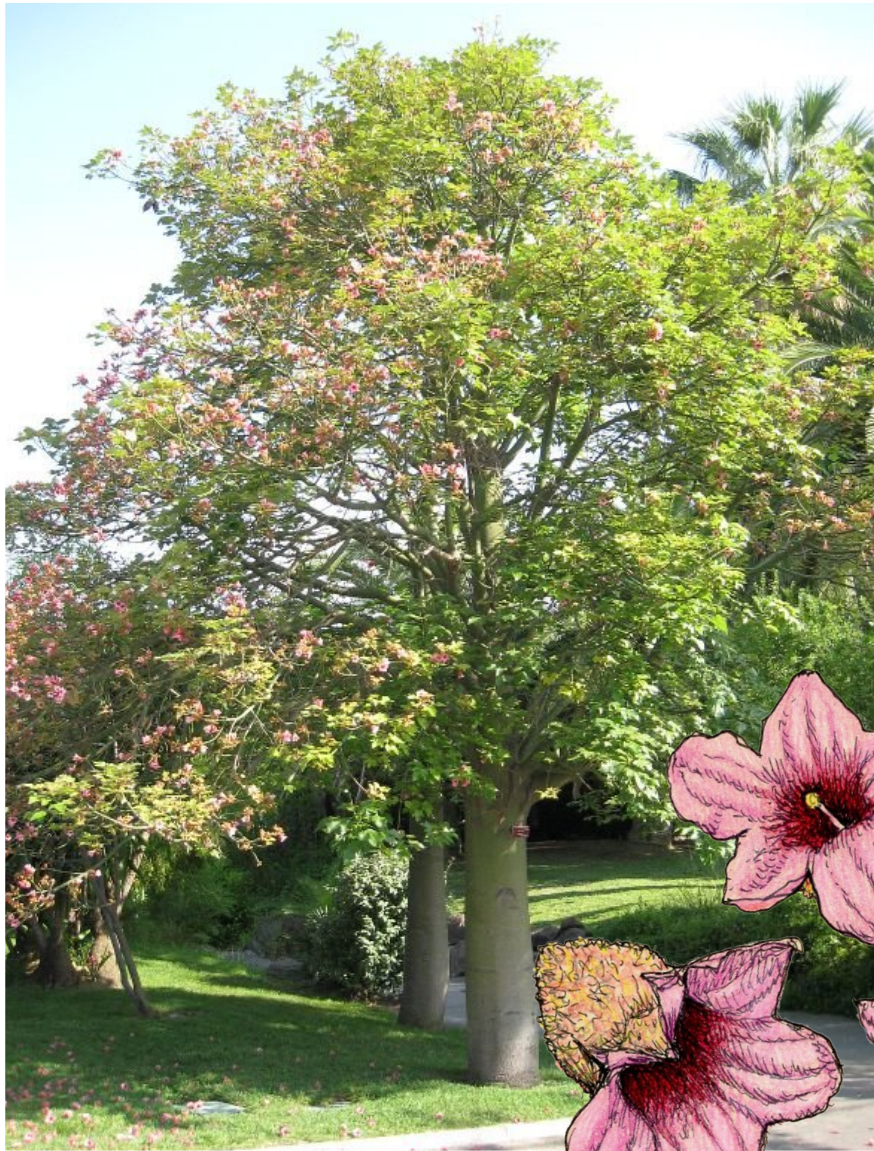


- Native to Eastern Australia and the Pacific Region
- Broad, evergreen tree to 8m
- Large, burgundy and dark green foliage and striking yellow flowers in Summer

## Coast Banksia

(*Banksia integrifolia*)



- Native to Eastern Australia
- Large evergreen tree to 25m
- Yellow bird attracting flowers from autumn to spring and pale green and silver foliage

## Coral Tree

(*Erythrina sykesii*)



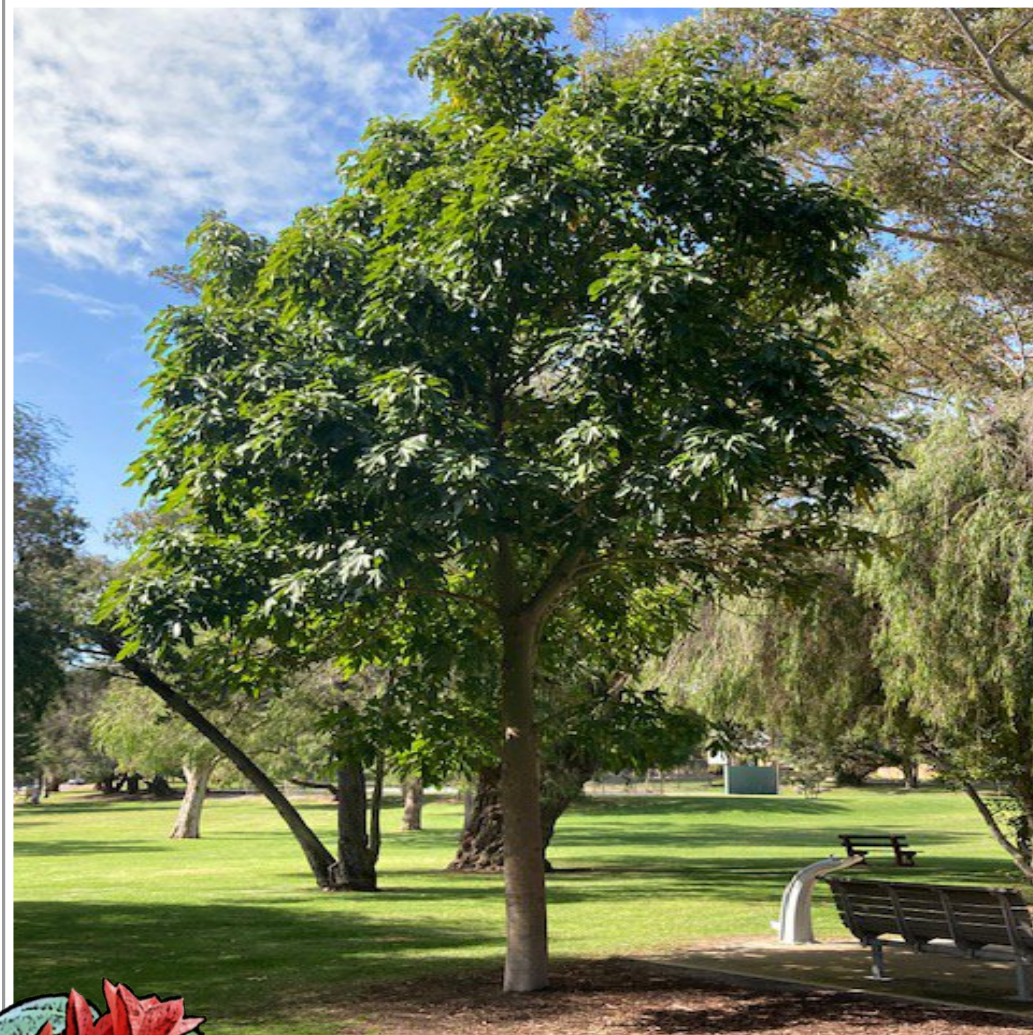
- This variety is of uncertain origin but Erythras occur naturally in many countries
- Large deciduous shade tree to 25m
- Produces red flowers on bare wood in Winter

## Illawarra Flame Tree

*(Brachychiton acerifolius)*



- Native to Eastern Australia
- Large semi deciduous tree to 30m
- Crimson flowers in spring and summer and small, glossy green leaves

*(Corymbia calophylla)*



- Native to Western Australia
- Large evergreen tree to 40m
- Large clusters of creamy white, bird attracting flowers in summer

- Medium, wide growing deciduous shade tree to 12m
- Small yellow flowers in Spring and yellow Autumn foliage

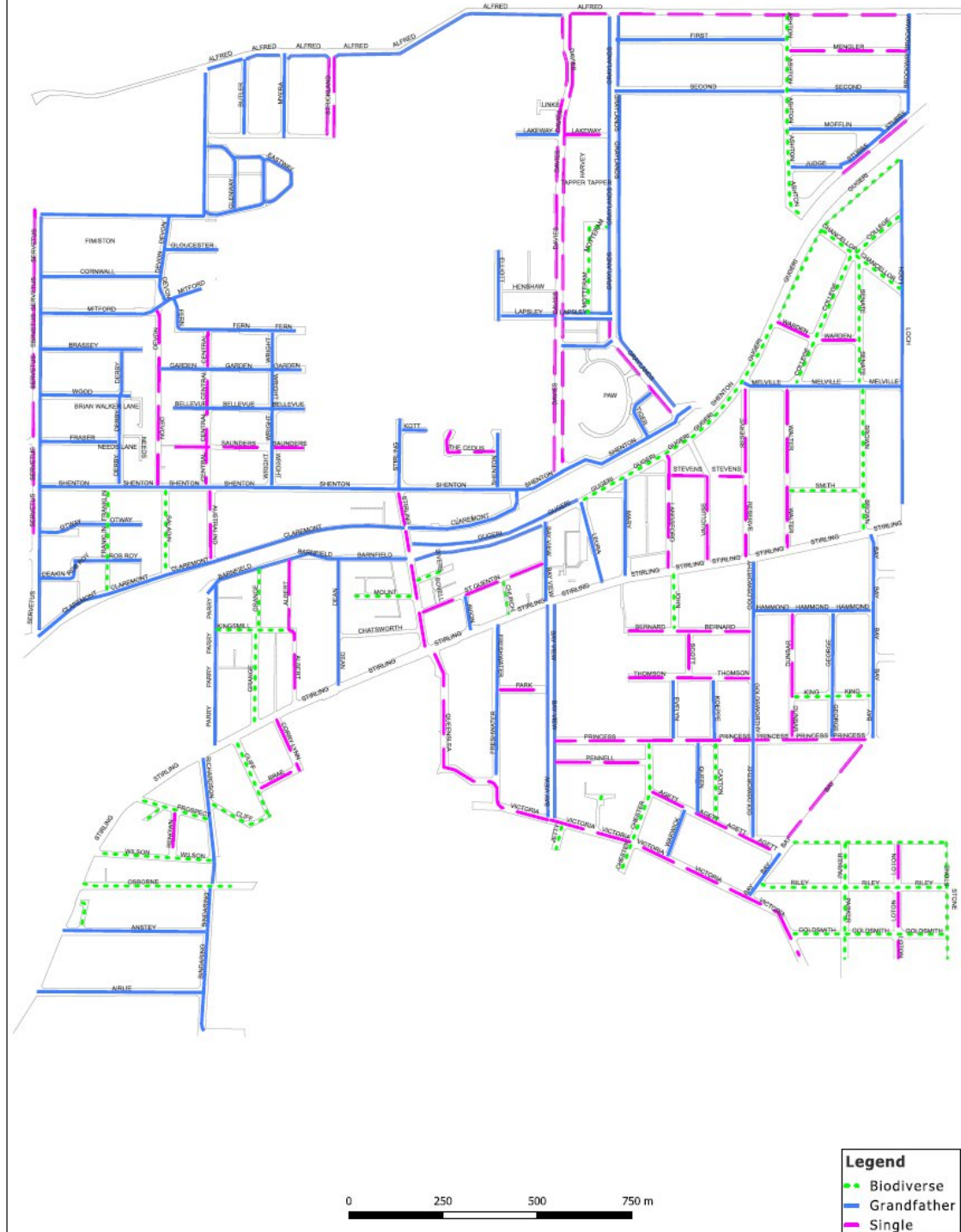
## Map of Street Classifications

**Single Species Tree Avenue-** Tree species remains the same as the 2013 Masterplan due to a strong existing theme and or species has grown successfully. All locations within the same street will receive the same tree species.

**Grandfather Species Avenue** -Tree species was a diseased tree and previously unsuccessful. Six species to be changed to a new more successful species are W.A. Peppermint, Red Flowering Gum, Liquidambar, Coral Tree, London Plane and Jarrah. All locations within the same street will receive the same new tree species.

**Biodiverse Streets-** Street contains a mixture of tree species, so any tree can be chosen from the recommended list based on verge size. All locations within the same street can receive a different tree species.
